Summer Reading Assignment - Form IV U.S. History II

<u>Assignment:</u> The incoming Form IV students will read <u>Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass</u>, an American Slave, Written by <u>Himself</u>. (1845) The rather short work is divided into eleven chapters in which the author remembers his life as a slave and describes his hopes for eventual freedom.

Requirement: Write a ½ to 1 page summary for each chapter of the book (turn in 11 pages/stapled). It should be **handwritten on lined paper in black pen** (print or cursive), and must be readable to get a passing grade! Your summaries should include two kinds of information:

- 1. <u>historical data</u> (e.g., a basic timeline of names of relatives, owners, and other important individuals, along with significant moves, places lived and worked, levels of education, etc.).
- 2. the <u>changing thoughts</u> of Douglass <u>about</u> the institution of <u>slavery</u> as he ages, experiences cruelty and degradation, and longs for freedom.

<u>Completion & Assessment:</u> This summary will be <u>due the first full day</u> of classes in the fall. In addition, a <u>quiz and/or a written evaluation</u> will be required of each student in class. These two grades (summary & quiz) will open the Quarter 1 grading period in U.S. History for the fall semester.
